



Economic implications that may arise from these measures



Some areas that are high at risk from Malaria are also in poverty, meaning that they do not have the money to use these preventative measures. Malaria essentially costs money, and most countries high at risk do not have a healthcare system put in place to help citizens who fall ill. Antimalarial drugs sometimes only treat the symptoms of malaria, therefore not preventing infection. Since there is no vaccination for malaria and only intermittent preventive treatment, it is important that people use preventative equipment where they have access to it. There are Malaria Treatment and Prevention Interventions happening and several companies and groups are at work on developing a malaria vaccine, but there is currently no effective malaria vaccine on the market. 


I walked through the Richmond park,
